

7 Arrows | February 7, 2018 Journey Group Questions

1. Often, we will only think about "What does this passage say and how should I respond?". The 7 Arrows are a helpful, visual aid for studying God's Word. Talk through each question with your Journey Group to see the benefit of asking each question as you read Scripture. why we have AWANA programs and why we continue to study God's word while becoming better students for the rest of our lives.
