



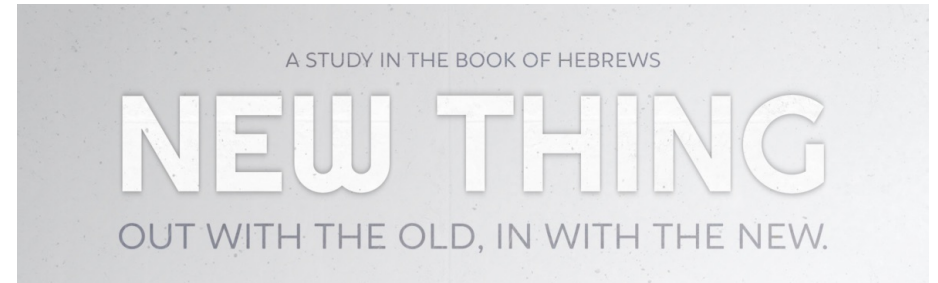
The next baptism is February 24th during the 10:30 service!

Hall of Faith | Hebrews 11 February 13, 2019

1. The only way to be saved is by exercising faith in the one, true God.

Faith is belief and trust in God which leads to active obedience.

2. Without faith, it's impossible to please God.

Old: Look forward in faith for their salvation.

New: Look back in faith for salvations and forward to glorification.

3. Trusting Jesus with our life requires faith that endures.
