


The next baptism is February 24th during the 10:30 service! If you would like to be baptized, talk to Pastor Scott tonight or email him at scott@exit137.org.

New Discipline |Hebrews 12:3-11 February 20, 2019

1. God <u>disciplines</u> those He loves.

2. God disciplines so we will become like <u>Jesus</u>.

Old: Israel received judgment like it was <u>punishment</u>.

New: Believers receive discipline as <u>corrective</u> love because Jesus has taken our <u>punishment</u>.

Journey Group Questions

1. Read Hebrews 12:3-11. When have you experienced discipline for doing the wrong thing? Did this help you to correct the wrong behavior/attitude or did you continue?

5. How does the story from John 9:1-12 refute ideas of philosophies like Karma?

4. Is every good thing you experience caused by something good that

you did? Is every hard thing caused by something sinful that you did?

Read John 9:1-12. Was this man made blind because someone had sinned? Was he healed because he had done something to earn it?

2. What motivates a parent to discipline their child? What does God say is His reason for disciplining us? (Hebrews 12:10)

6. When was the last time you asked God to help you to become more disciplined? When you sense that God may be using circumstances to discipline you, how can you examine your heart for any sin and repent from sin in your life?

3. What is the goal of discipline? (Hebrews 12:11)
