Q: What is the chief end of man?

A: To Glorify God and enjoy Him forever!

1. God created us to image Himself.
2. God created us for intimacy with Himself.

Implications:

- Because I was made to glorify God, satisfaction can only be found in God. My faith is a joy not a burden.
- I was made to image God, therefore I should seek to multiply, lead, and love as He does.
- God made me for intimacy with Himself, my relationship with Him should not be impersonal or distant.

Journey Group Questions

1. What does “gospel” mean? What do we as Christians use this term to describe? What are some common ways it is misunderstood?

2. Give at least 3 reasons why it is important for us to study the gospel.

3. Read Genesis 1:26, Romans 8:29, 2 Corinthians 3:18, and Colossians 3:10. The term for *image* used in these verses is the same used for making a statue of someone, or the stamp of a face on a coin. What does it mean that we are made in the image of God?

4. Read Genesis 1:26-31. Pastor Izzy mentioned Sunday that after making man in His image, He commanded Him to create, lead, and love. Where do you see these 3 in this passage? In what ways are we still commanded to image God’s likeness by creating, leading, and loving?

5. The Westminster Catechism says that mankind’s chief end is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever. What is the relationship between our joy and glorifying God?

6. Read Genesis 2:29 & 3:8. These verses describe mankind’s intended relationship with God. Before sin, they walked in the garden with Him naked and unashamed. What does this tell us about the relationship God wants with us?
